As children spend more time online, it's important that we help them develop safe and healthy digital habits. With AI becoming increasingly common, children may come across AI-generated images, videos and information that can look very realistic but may not be true.

A few simple steps can make a big difference:

- Talk regularly about what your child is doing online and who they are interacting with.
- Encourage them to check before believing or sharing something they see online.
- Remind them never to share personal information or photos without checking with a trusted adult.
- Keep the conversation open so they know they can come to you if something online worries or upsets them.

Technology is an important part of children's lives, and our aim is to help them use it safely, confidently and responsibly.

Year 2 Class Write Up

Year 2 have had a busy start to the year and settled well into their new class. We have been learning all about the power of yet with our English text 'The Magical yet' and enjoyed starting our new fluency shed scheme that is helping us to become fluent readers! In Maths we have been learning all about place value and learning to represent numbers in different ways using resources to help us. Our new Science topic is 'Living things and their habitats'. We started by thinking about what it meant to be alive and went on a hunt of the school grounds to find different things that were dead, alive or never alive. This week we started to explore biomes and learnt about the rainforest, tundra and desert. We found out about different animals that live there and considered how they are adapted to suit the environment.
